BENJAMIN BANNEKER WEEK JAMES W. GILLEY

This week is Benjamin Bennecker a famous mathematician and astronomer born in 1731 and one of the first African American to achieve distinction in science, despite being self-taught. He created a wooden clock that kept perfect time recorded and tracked it efficiently. He also correctly predicted a solar eclipse back in 1789 which was phenomenal being self-taught and only relying on books that he could find. His lab was a farmhouse which was burned down at his funeral. This shows that with determination on what you want to be, and how much you want it you can achieve anything with motivation and perseverance. This week we honor him for the purpose of his life that led to more African Americans and more to succeed because of Benjamin Bennecker's inspirational story of being a farm boy in rough times to a famous scholar.



THE 45TH DIVISION -ROBERT CASTRO

In the southwest of the country. National Guard forces established the 45th Infantry Division in 1924. The "Thunderbird" division was reconstituted in 1940 and sent to North Africa at the end of June 1943. The division landed in Sicily the following month and faced Axis forces in action. The 45th was able to repel German attacks on its positions in Anzio in February 1944 after moving across the Italian peninsula. In August 1944, the unit crossed the nation and was dispatched to southern France. By the end of the year, it had swiftly crossed the border into Germany after moving across western France. The "Thunderbird" division crossed the Rhine and moved south in March 1945. It took control of Nuremberg on April 20 and on April 30, in Munich.
