NEW RECORD IN THE BOOKS -ROBERT CASTRO

In the history of collegiate basketball, including women's and men's, Tara VanDerveer of Stanford has set a new record for the most coaching victories. In a game Stanford hosted against Oregon State at Maples Pavilion on Sunday, VanDerveer recorded her 1,203rd victory, surpassing former Duke men's coach Mike "Coach K" Krzyzewski. After the 70-year-old coach tied the record for most victories on Friday, her 38th season at Stanford and 45th overall, celebrations got underway. Coach K needed 47 seasons to hit this mark.

VanDerveer quickly transformed Stanford into an NCAA powerhouse and is credited for increasing attendance at women's games. She has guided the Cardinals to 25 conference regular-season championships and three NCAA Championships. Eight WNBA championships have been won by seven Stanford alums. She left Stanford during the 1995-96 season to take over as head coach of the women's national team, which she guided to an unbeaten record and a gold medal at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Current Utah women's basketball coach Lynne Roberts had this to say about VanDerveer, "She makes it about her players, she makes it about her staff, she makes it about Stanford. She gives credit to the other team. "She's just a class act. And you know, I think we all could take a page from that." These historical moments by Tara VanDerveer show how thrilling being a basketball coach is.
